

AncestryDNA — the new

test analyzes your autosomal DNA, which includes the entire genome—all 23 pairs of chromosomes—as opposed to only looking at the Y-chromosome or Mitochondrial DNA. YDNA tests only look at about 40 locations whereas AncestryDNA comprehensively looks at the entire genome at over 700,000 locations, all with a simple saliva sample. Significant is that Y-DNA tests only the father and mtDNA tests the mother's side, but autosomal DNA tests everything to give a clearer picture

of one's genetic ancestry. Not everyone take the new test, but it also provides a more complete picture of your family history.

Currently Ancestry is only in the Beta test of this product so pricing has yet to be determined. Watch the website for



It was the closing ceremony that brought the biggest shock. Clan Johnstone in America was named the best overall clan present and awarded the 2012 Celtic Cup. This award is presented to the clan that has the best total of tent presentation, crowd interaction and knowledge of both Scottish and clan history. It also means that Clan Johnstone will attend and be one of judges at next year's festival.

Famous Scottish Inventions


Here are some pretty cool things you may have around your home that were invented by a Scot.

Television: In 1925 inventer John Logie Baird sent and received the first wireless television signal.

Postage stamps: In 1837 in a proposal to his MP, including one penny and two penny versions, inventer Scott James Chalmers proposed the adhesive postal stamp.

Bicycle: In 1839 Kirkpatrick MacMillan, a blacksmith at Courthill Smithy of Keir Mill, Dumfriesshire, invented the first wheel-propelled bicycle.

Telephone: Born in Edinburgh in 1847, Alexander Graham Bell's research on hearing and experiments with hearing devices lead to the first U.S. patent of the telephone in 1876.
